Data protection information - events

With the following data protection information, we would like to give you an overview of the processing of your personal data by us at events and your rights under data protection law.

1. Who is responsible for data processing and who can you contact?

2. What data do we process in connection with events and what sources do we use?

We process the personal data that we have received from you or from a third party commissioned by you when you register for events. Relevant personal data are your personal details (name, address, contact details). In addition, we create photo, film and sound recordings ourselves or commission specialized service providers (e.g. photographers) for specific events. If persons are specifically photographed or filmed, we also regularly store the name and contact details of the persons concerned, their function and activity and the reason for the recording.

3. For what purposes and on what legal basis is your data processed?

We process personal data in accordance with the provisions of the European Data Protection General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the Data Protection Act.

• For the fulfillment of contractual obligations (Art. 6 para. 1 lit. b GDPR)

As part of the implementation and organization of our events, personal data is processed in order to be able to organize your registration and participation in the event.

• As part of the legitimate interests (Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR)

Photos and/or videos will be taken at the event venue, which may be used for the purpose of documenting the event and for press coverage and may be published in various (social) media, publications and on the Oberbank website (www.oberbank.at) (legitimate interest in documentation). If you do not wish to be photographed, you can object at any time - please inform the photographer accordingly. In addition, we will, if necessary, process your data to protect legitimate interests. Examples of this are

- Assertion of legal claims and defense in legal disputes;
- Measures to protect customers and employees as well as the bank's property (e.g. video surveillance to safeguard domiciliary rights and to collect evidence in the event of criminal offenses);
- Measures for building and system security (e.g. access controls).

Right to object pursuant to Art. 21 GDPR

You have the right to object, on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time to processing of personal data concerning you which is based on point (f) of Art. 6 (1) GDPR (data processing on the basis of

a balancing of interests). If you object, we will no longer process your personal data unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing serves the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims.

4. Who receives your data?

Within Oberbank AG, those departments and employees who need your data to fulfill the intended purpose will have access to it. In addition, service providers commissioned by us (processors pursuant to Art. 28 GDPR) will receive your data if they are required to fulfill the respective service. These are companies in the categories of IT services, logistics, printing services, telecommunications, marketing and photography. All processors and sales partners are contractually obliged to maintain confidentiality about all facts of which they become aware and must treat your data confidentially. As part of the above-mentioned documentation purpose, photos/videos may be published in print and online media, as well as on the Oberbank website and profiles on the Internet or on social media platforms.

5. Is data transferred to a third country or to an international organization?

Data will be transferred to bodies in countries outside the European Union (so-called third countries) if our vicarious agents are based in third countries and this is necessary for the execution of the event or is required by law, if you have given us your express consent or if one of the exceptions in Art. 44 et seq. of the GDPR is fulfilled. We will inform you separately about the details, if required by law.

6. How long will your data be stored?

We process and store your personal data only for as long as is necessary to fulfill the purposes described. If your personal data is no longer required, it will be deleted regularly.

7. What data protection rights do you have?

Every data subject has the right of access (Art. 15 GDPR), rectification (Art. 16 GDPR), erasure (Art. 17 GDPR), restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR), data portability (Art. 20 GDPR) and the right to object to data processing, insofar as this is based on legitimate interest (Art. 21 GDPR). If you believe that the processing of your personal data does not comply with data protection regulations, please contact us so that we can clarify your concerns. In addition, you have the right to submit your concerns in connection with the processing of your personal data to a supervisory authority in the EU. In Austria, the supervisory authority is the:
